Pc Mick Judge, who heads

"The event was well attended, around 50 people turning up on the Sunday morning. Around a dozen bags of rubbish were collected, along with numerous bottles. Kirton certainly looked the

Kirton's Police Community Support Officer, Adam Eden, was one of the event's key organisers, having heard many of the villagers' concerns about rubbish being left around the centre of Kirton.

"It was a great team effort and we are really grateful to all those who came along to support us," he said.
