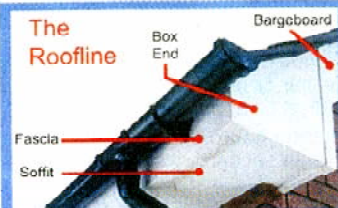
defended the move, saying there wasn't usually a problem with children being photographed, provided all the parents concerned agreed to it.

But Mr Cashmore said gang shows or other events involving more than one group of chil-

dren complicated the issue because it was difficult to make sure all the parents concerned had been consulted.

"If a policy has been made it is usually because not all parents have agreed for their children to be photographed," he said. "If this is the case, an order is made preventing any pictures being taken so as to protect children."
