Falklands appeal

LOUTH'S Mayor, Coun Ken West, along with businessman Ian Henderson, launched a local appeal for those lost in the Falklands conflict.

Both men opened the appeal with £100 donations and said all money would go to the main national appeal.

Water main bursts

THE centre of Louth was plunged into traffic chaos when a water main burst on the corner of Eastgate and Church Street.

The road was closed for two days while workmen repaired the damage.

At one point a nose to tail traffic jam built up from Commercial Road along Ramsgate, James Street and into Northgate.

BILL Allinson, Chairman of Louth United Football Club, said he was shocked and upset at vandalism at the Park Avenue ground.

Thousands of pounds worth of damage was caused to the terraces and changing rooms.
