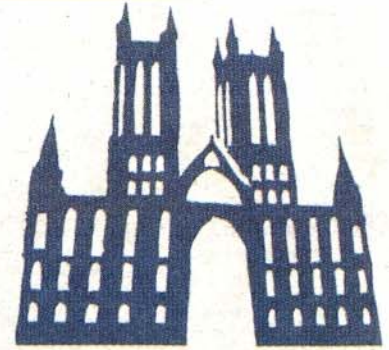

## Scouts enjoy flypast treat

SCOUTS in Lincolnshire have joined nearly 30,000,000 youngsters celebrating the 100th anniversary of a movement that has spanned the globe.

Members of the St Giles 14th Scout group recited their promise next to RAF Waddington's famous gate guard, the Avro Vulcan, as the sun came up today.

And while many groups celebrated at village landmarks and headquarters, Explorer Scouts

from Lincoln were due to stand on top of Lincoln Cathedral at 9am when aircraft from RAF Cranwell were to perform a flypast.

Scout leader Sandra Donnor said: "I think it's special because of the fact that you are doing it with 28,000,000 other people. It's quite awe inspiring."

It is exactly 100 years since Robert Baden Powell held his first experimental Scout camp on Brownsea Island in Dorset.
