Train station given arty facelift

Friday, 10.10am - MOSAICS created at the Poacher 2008 Lincolnshire Scout and Guide International Camp in Lincoln will be displayed at Skegness train station as part of Lincolnshire's first Community Rail Partnership.

Scouts from around the world gathered for the camp at Lincolnshire Showground between July 26-August 2, and the mosaics were made as part of the craft activities.

Peter Roberts from the partnership, said: "We started partnerships 10 years ago and built them up. This is the first one in Lincolnshire and we came up with a community rail development strategy with central government to look for plans of what can be done, to include the Poacher line."

Scouts visiting Skegness delivered the mosaics and were excited to have travelled the Poacher line and to be in the area.

Patricia Hensley, a scout leader from Alaska, USA, said: "It is fantastic and we made notes along the route. It is the third poacher I've been on and the next one will be for the Olympics in London. It is a trip of a lifetime."

Mr Roberts added: "We would like to thank East Midland trains for providing 20 tickets for the day out."
